5 Six Nations Rebels in 2010 NLL Draft

TORONTO – Former Six Nations Rebels' **Cody Jamieson** was drafted 1st overall by the Rochester Knighthawks at the National Lacrosse League (NLL) held 2010 Entry Draft which were held at the Harbor Castle Westin Wednesday night. This is 2nd consecutive year a former Six Nations Rebels player has gone 1st overall in the NLL draft as **Sid Smith** was selected by the same Rochester Knighthawks in 2009 NLL Entry Draft.

Other Rebels players selected were **Wayne VanEvery** (21st), **Alex Kedoh Hill** (29th), **Holdon Vyse** (37th) and **Marty Hill** (44th).



Cody Jamieson played for the Rebels in 2002 playoffs and 2003 season. Jamieson was a 15 year-old when he played 1 playoff game against the Sarnia Pacers in which he scored 3 goals and added 1 assist in his Jr debut. The following regular season Jamieson finished with 39 (21G, 18A) points help the Rebels to a 16-2-2 record. During the 2003 playoffs, Jamieson finished with 36 (16G, 20A) points. The 2003 Rebels eliminated Orangeville, Elora and St. Catharines before dropping a 5-game Ontario Jr B Finals to Barrie Tornado. Jamieson graduated to the Six Nations Jr A Arrows and helped them to win the 2007 Minto Cup and win Minto Cup MVP award.

Rebels **Wayne VanEvery** was selected in the 2nd round and 21st overall by the Buffalo Bandits. VanEvery led the OLA Jr B league with 101 (52G, 49A) points for the 2010 regular season in which the Rebels were a perfect 20-and-0 record. **VanEvery** did win the Fan Choice as MVP for the 2010 season. Over his 5-year career with the Rebels, VanEvery set Franchise record of Most Combined goals with 176. VanEvery tied the franchise mark for his 101 points which tied the 2004 mark set another NLL player, Cody Jacobs.

Alex Kedoh Hill was drafted in the 3rd round, 29th overall by the Edmonton Rush. Hill played 3 seasons for the Rebels starting in 2007 when he accumulated 14 (8G, 6A) points in 14 games. In 2007 playoffs Hill played 10 games scoring 9 (2G, 7A) points. The Rebels swept Hamilton, needed 4 games to get passed Owen Sound, swept Windsor before sweeping Clarington in the OLA Jr B Finals to advance to the Founders Cup in Kamloops, BC. Hill found his scoring touch in the Founders Cup tournament by finishing with 14 (8G, 6A) points in 7 games. In 2008, Hill continued his development by scoring 40 (22G, 18A) points in 19 games as the Rebels were a perfect 20-and-0 during the Regular season. Hill played 12 playoff games and scored 27 (9G, 18A) points as the Rebels swept Wallaceburg, needed 4 games against Windsor and 5 games to defeat Elora. Rebels then defeated Halton Hills Bulldogs in 4 games to win the Ontario title to advance to the Founders Cup in Guelph. Hill finished 2nd in scoring by netting 23 (8G, 15A) points in 7 games. In 2009 Hill played 9 games scoring 22 (10G, 12A) points before graduating to the Jr A Arrows full-time.

Holdon Vyse was selected by the 4th round, 37th overall by the Buffalo Bandits. Vyse was drafted in the 2nd round, 18th overall in the 2009 NLL Draft by the Rochester Knighthawks. Vyse was able re-enter the draft since he did not play for the Knighthawks in 2009. Vyse played the 2004 season for the Rebels. Vyse scored 14 (5G, 9A) points in 17 games during the Regular season. Vyse added 8 (6G, 2A) points in 4 playoff games against the Owen Sound Flying Dutchmen. Vyse graduated the following season to the Jr A Arrows to culminate with a 2007 Minto Cup Championship.

Marty Hill was selected in the 5th round, 44th overall by the Rochester Knighthawks. Hill helped the Rebels win Back-to-Back Founders Cup championships in 2007 and 2008. Hill also was the Rebels captain for the 2009 season and as the captain Marty got to carry the Olympic Torch when it passed through Six Nations Territory on December 21, 2009.

Hill began his career with the Rebels back in 2005 playing in 7 games finishing with 5 (3G, 2A) points. In 2006, Hill played 4 games finished with 4 (2G, 2A) points. The 2007 was Hill's breakout year as he scored 44 (17G, 27A) points in 19 games. Hill added 39 (14G, 25A) points in 13 playoff games. Hill capped 2007 off with 24 (13G, 11A) points in 7 Founders Cup games.

2008 saw Hill play 13 games while contributing 38 (16G, 22A) points in the Regular season. In the playoffs Hill managed 29 (12G, 17A) points in 15 games. Hill capped 2008 with another Founders Cup win. This time it was in Guelph where Marty scored 6 (3G, 3A) points in 5 Founders Cup games.

2009 saw Hill finish with his most productive point total at 45 (21G, 24A) points in 13 games. Hill was able to play in only 8 of the 15 playoff games where Marty scored 15 (9G, 6A) points. Marty graduated to the Six Nations Jr A Arrows Express for the 2010 season.
